



High Point Program rules

Categories – Champion and Reserve are awarded:

Overall High Point, Youth and Adult

1. Only sound Walking horses and Spotted Saddle horses will be considered for High Point awards.
2. Participant must be a member to be considered for PPWHANC High Point Awards and to enter PPWHANC member's only classes.
3. Points are calculated based on a horse/rider combination. The exception is the Green Rider division which is calculated only by the rider.
4. Points from all horse shows sponsored by PPWHANC count toward high points in their respective divisions. First place gets six points; second place gets five points; third place gets four points; fourth place gets three points; fifth place gets two points and sixth place gets one point.
5. Racking and Green Rider points are awarded for registered and unregistered horses.
6. Only classes specified as "YOUTH" will be counted in the applicable youth divisions of ADP, CP, TP, LS and CPS.
7. Trail Pleasure, Lite Shod, Classic Park Shod, Versatility, and Overall High Point points are awarded to registered Walking Horses only.
8. Spotted Saddle Horse points are awarded only to horses registered as Spotted Saddle Horses.
9. Green Rider classes will count toward Green Rider High Points ONLY.
10. The Green Rider Division is for participants who only show at Fun Shows. Riders who show at dress shows or at 4H sponsored Horse Shows are not eligible to show in this division. Riders in this division may not cross-enter into other divisions. However, they may show in Versatility classes (game classes) and other classes not specific to any other division (ie. GAYP, Tack & Attire, etc.).
11. Versatility points include such classes as trail obstacle, model, showmanship, equitation, western riding, reining, poles, barrels, driving, water glass, jumping, and dressage. Other classes may be included as defined by the TWHBEA Versatility Program rules
12. Points in the following divisions count toward Overall High Point:

Racking, Spotted Saddle Horse and Academy classes DO NOT count toward Overall High Point.

13. Green Rider, Versatility and Overall Championship ties will be broken on the basis of total equitation and/or horsemanship points earned. If a tie still exists, the contestant with the most points in the showmanship classes will be declared the champion. If a tie still exists, the exhibitor who places in the greater number of classes will be declared the champion.
14. Rail class division (such as All Day Pleasure, Country Pleasure, Trail Pleasure, Lite Shod, Classic Park Shod, Spotted Saddle Horse, and Racking) ties will be broken on the basis of the exhibitor who places in the greater number of classes will be declared the champion.
15. The PPWHANC Board of Directors reserves the right to designate any show as a multiple point show.
16. All recipients of awards will be contacted prior to awards presentation.
